- *Applied Innovation, Inc., et al. v. Commercial Recovery Corporation*, No. 11-330 JPH (E.D. Wash) - Represented patentee of U.S. Patent No. 7,167,839. Prevailed against two motions for summary judgment that attempted to invalidate patent. See *Applied Innovation, Inc., et al.*, 2012 WL 3578182 (E.D. Wash. Aug. 17, 2012) and *Applied Innovation, Inc., et al.*, 2013 WL 4214319 (E.D. Wash Aug. 14, 2013).

- *Trocaderos, LLC v. City of Minneapolis, et al*, A08-1229 (Minn. Ct. App. 2009) - summary judgment for clients the City of Minneapolis and one of its council members affirmed. Defamation claims brought by nightclub dismissed.
- *Nutter, Ford v. Northern Financial Systems, et al*, Civ. No. 07-293, 2007 WL 1072609 (D. Minn. August 8, 2007) - summary judgment for client collection agency against plaintiff's claims under the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act.
- *City of Minneapolis v. Ames & Fischer*, No. CT-04-016998 (Hennepin Cty. Dist. Ct.) - Represented the City of Minneapolis in a lawsuit involving performance obligations under a contract relating to operation of a public parking facility.
